The roadmap of UNITA

Challenge 1: An integrated governance within 20 years

The governance is founded on **4 principles of integration**:

- A mutual recognition of competences, ECTS, curricula and Bachelor's, Master's and PhD's degrees in order to reduce existing administrative barriers and promote all types of mobility within the alliance
- The promotion of common culture based on the Romance languages and the multiculturalism
- The application of integrated flagship curricula according to the thematic priorities of the Alliance namely renewable energy, circular economy and cultural heritage

• Sharing and dissemination of pedagogical principles especially research-oriented education and innovative pedagogical methods

Challenge 2: Reach the excellence in research and education by setting up an opened and networked university

The approach consists in a research-oriented education linked to the social and economic ecosystem of our territories. UNITA aims at supporting the economic and social ecosystem of the local regions each university is based.

Main actions are:

- Thematic research hubs
- Collaborative projects
- Long life learning
- Challenge-based approach
- Innovation and transfer hubs

Challenge 3: Enforce recognized diplomas within the alliance to the European level

The main goal is to create diplomas recognized within the alliance based on common standard such as procedure, credits recognition, etc. The keystone of the alliance will be the mutual trust between the main partners in order to apply the ECTS and diplomas recognition and offer the best conditions of success to obtain national and European recognitions.

The main actions are:

- The implementation of common educational bodies
- An ambitious plan to design UNITA diplomas
- To promote the recognition of UNITA diplomas at the European level

Challenge 4: Student-centered high-level curricula and approaches

UNITA proposes to develop a flexible and customizable educational framework that will be implemented as a guiding student-centered innovative pedagogy where the students will be able to choose the most suited educational issue, topic or module from the different universities of the alliance.

The main actions are:

- The implementation of multilingualism and inter-comprehensive methods
- The setting up of UNITA innovative teaching and learning centres
- The creation of a "Hub of success" to support the professional and personal development of students
- Implementation of customized curricula

Challenge 5: Shape an international campus

Students will benefit from the vibrant environments offered by the campuses involved in the project, both in terms of scientific knowledge and competences, and in terms of relationships with local stakeholders, like public bodies and private companies.

The main actions are:

- Generalising virtual and physical mobility
- The promotion of student social engagement
- Opening connection to international students using Romance languages
